IV. UPDATES FROM THE CHANCELLOR'S OFFICE

. Administration Update to the Faculty Senate April 24, 2023

Recruitment and Enrollment

- New first time undergraduate students (17 weeks before classes):
 - 12,836 have applied for the Fall term, which is an increase of nearly 23% over last fall and nearly double of fall 2019.
 - o 622 more students have been admitted this year over last year, an increase of 7.4%

- Registrations are up 23.5% compared to the same point last year
- For transfer students, applications are up 18% and admissions are up 2.2%
- 2,065 students have accepted some type of scholarship that we have offered.
- Housing contracts are up 16.2% over last year and 19% over Fall 2019
- Graduate School applications are up 16% and admissions are up 128% compared to last year.

Research and Graduate School

- The VCR invites all faculty to attend a talk by Dr. Debora Rodrigues, the Ezekiel Cullen Professor
 of Environmental Engineering at the University of Houston, TX. who is currently rotating at NSF
 and serving as NSF program officer for the Partnerships for Innovation (PFI), Mid-Career
 Advancement (MCA), and Bioinspired programs. The presentation will take place over Zoom on
 April 25, 1:30-2:30pm.
- The office of the VCR selected 22 REACH awardees for next year. The REACH (Research-Enriched Academic Challenge) award offers the opportunity for SIU Carbondale undergraduate students to work with a faculty member on independent creative activities or research.
- On April 13 the OVCR organized the Student Research & Creative Activities Forum is held each spring to showcase the work of undergraduate and graduate students in all disciplines. Nineteen winners were selected by a panel of judges, and eight of the posters will be shared with the Board of Trustees during the next Board meeting on April 27.
- On April 3, 2023 during our "Let's Talk Research" meeting a panel of six SIUC faculty discussed NSF proposals with over 30 attendees.

Other news

- Jeff Harmon will be publicly announced later this month as the campus's new Chief Marketing Officer, effective June 1. His LinkedIn profile is here for those interested in reviewing his background, which includes growing up in southern Illinois and working at a number of universities and in the private sector. Please join the chancellor in providing Jeff a warm welcome to SIU Carbondale and thanking Jim Potter for his dedicated service as CMO.
- An offer has been extended and accepted for the assistant vice chancellor for human resources and that person will be announced soon. It is expected he will start on June 1.
- A preliminary analysis of the April 20 active threat training showed the drill was a success. More details can be found here. SIU Police Chief Ben Newman will provide brief remarks on the training to the SIU Board of Trustees on April 27.
