I. SIUC AS AN R1 INSTITUTION: A GREAT RECOGNITION OF OUR FACULTY WORK WITH MORE CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

The highest ranked tier for research universities in the United States is the R1 classification, also known as "Doctoral Universities: Very High Research Activity." It has recently been announced that SIUC has earned this status! We are all very proud of our university's accomplishment and are excited to continue the work to maintain it. In the state of Illinois, there are only three public universities (UIUC, UIC and SIUC) and three private ones (University of Chicago, Northwestern, and Loyola University Chicago) with R1 status. In total, there are only 187 institutions with R1 status in the nation.

Why is it important to us? First, it is a great recognition of our university's research, scholarship, economic development, and doctoral student training/mentorship. Second, it will certainly help us to recruit and retain the best and brightest students and faculty members from various backgrounds nationally and internationally.

With that being said, we will have more challenges and opportunities with the R1 status as we work to maintain our R1 status and to grow our research further. For example, from our university's perspective, some may ask: How shall we match our faculty salaries and pay as an R1 institution commensurate with other R1 peers? Because the state budget and federal support are unstable, increasing our enrollment and fundraising/endowment, and enhancing our academic reputation/innovation and economic impact might be most helpful activities for SIU Carbondale.
